#### AUTISM INCLUSION – TEACHER AT STRADBROKE SCHOOL

Autism Inclusion Teachers are a new, nation-leading initiative which aims to build educator understanding and knowledge around supporting autistic children and young people.

At Stradbroke School, we welcome Lisa Selby as our Autism Inclusion Teacher. Our Autism Inclusion Teacher will take on the role 1 day per week from term 1 2023.

The Autism Inclusion Teacher will assist teachers, leaders and Student Services Officers (SSOs) to:

- improve inclusive practices in their individual school community
- access evidence-based resources about supporting autistic students
- use contemporary strategies in teaching autistic students

It is anticipated that Autism Inclusion Teachers will first build their own teaching expertise, knowledge and understanding of autism through engaging in formal learning offerings and participation in the Autism Inclusion Teacher networks. To improve knowledge and practice across the school, Autism Inclusion Teachers will then be encouraged to share their learnings and resources with their colleagues to utilise in teaching autistic children and young people in their own classes.

#### STRADBROKE SCHOOL DRESS CODE AND UNIFORM POLICY

Stradbroke School has a dress code and uniform policy. This decision was made with the Governing Council in consultation with the Stradbroke School community. The benefits of students wearing a school uniform are;

- promoting a positive image of the school
- . creating a sense of identity among students and the community
- supporting student safety through ease of identification •
- making sure students are dressed appropriately for all school activities.

Here is a list of what the students can wear to school.

Navy blue pants - fleece, bootleg, drill, track pant (with no visible logos, stripes or patterns)

Navy shorts (basketball, cargo, drill)

#### Navy blue skort

Shorts and skirts must be no shorter than to the length of the student's middle finger when they are standing with their hands by their sides.

Please note denim jeans and denim shorts are not included in the school uniform.

#### **Footwear & Tights**

#### Absence

Please telephone the school between 8.15am - 9.30am on 8365 5621, email school the on dl.0923.absences@schools.sa.edu.au or notify us via the Skoolbag app if your child is absent. If children are absent and a message has not been received, an email will be sent to Parent 1 requesting that they contact the school and explain the absence.

#### Late

If your child is late (after 8.50am), a caregiver must accompany him/her to sign in at Student Services in the Front Office before going to the classroom.

#### Early

If your child needs to be away from school during school hours, e.g. to keep a dental or doctor's appointment, a caregiver is required to come to Student Services in the Front Office and sign their child out before leaving the school. Please note children are not permitted to wait in the pick-up zone as it is unsupervised. Children must be collected from the Front Office. On return, an adult must accompany the child back to Student Services and sign them back in.

#### **Exemptions**

If a family holiday/travel is planned during term time, a student exemption form (ED176) needs to be collected from the Front Office, completed and submitted to the Principal for approval.

#### CANTEEN CASHLESS COUNTER SALES:

Please check with your children if they are spending the Cashless Counter sales vouchers you have purchased before buying more. I have updated my "book" in the Canteen and carried forward all the unused money from 2022. Ask your children to come and see me if they think they still have money.

#### **MONEY OWED TO CANTEEN:**

Please only use this option on Qkr if you have been instructed to pay money owing for late or lost lunches. This is not where you purchase the Cashless Counter Sales Vouchers.

#### WEDNESDAY AFTER SCHOOL ICE BLOCK SALES:

We are back! It's been a few years, due to Covid, but we are happy to announce we are recommencing ice block sales. The Canteen will be open every Wednesday 3:10pm - 3:25pm for the sale of ice blocks and slushies only. If you see a long line and are willing to help serve for 10 minutes, come on in!! Prepurchased ice block vouchers or Cashless Counter sale vouchers will be the preferred means of payment.

#### KISS AND DROP

To ensure that this area runs smoothly we ask all parents, guardians and carers who access this space to be aware of our procedures listed below; to ensure a safe and efficient drop-off and pick-up.

- Drive to the front to allow for cars coming in and out to flow smoothly.
- Students to alight from the car on the left-hand side only onto the footpath.
- Parents need to remain in the car. Students who use the Kiss & Drop zone must be capable of getting in and out of the car by themselves, including putting on their seat belt. If they are not able to do so parents will need to park in a designated carpark space and assist them.
- School bags should be in the car and not retrieved/placed from the boot. These need to be in the car with the student so that students do not have to go behind or in between cars.
- Students are not to enter or leave cars which are waiting in line to use the zone - please be patient and wait until you are safely parked in the zone.
- Please ensure you have your handbrake on once you have pulled into the zone and stopped.
- Staff supervision will be present at the start and end of each day.
- Please ensure that if parking and bringing your child/ren into the school, that you use the crossings and pathways provided. We ask that you do not walk on our landscaped areas or through the staff carparks.

#### Accessible parking:

Designated disabled car parks are located within the staff car parks adjacent to the Front Office and Flexi buildings. These spaces are only for use by those families displaying a Disabled Parking permit collecting students with a disability.

Due to the limited number of disabled car parks available, where possible, these are only for families collecting students with a disability. If you have a disability but the children you pick up are able, please use one of the alternative parking options and have them walk to you.

#### **KIDSMATTER WEEK**

Week 1 at Stradbroke School, all students are involved in Kidsmatter Week. Kidsmatter week is a week long program where students form the class routines and procedures with their new classmates and teachers, revise the Play Is the Way concepts, discuss what the difference between an incident and bullying is, as well as, meet with their buddy classes to establish their Action Teams. Classes also discuss cyber safety, student voice, leadership and what to do if they have a problem they need help solving. The week long program enables students to get to know each other and build positive relationships. It has been fantastic to see all the students involved in the program.



L6 & L10 hosted a fantastic assembly at the end of week 2 where they reminded all the students of the Play Is The Way concepts, as well as the school rules!

#### **PLAY IS THE WAY**

PLAY IS THE WAY is a practical approach for teaching social and emotional learning using guided play, classroom activities and empowering language. All classes use this language and have the posters displayed. Ask your child to tell you all the concepts!





#### **ACTION TEAMS**

All R-6 classes have been partnered up as Buddy Classes again this year as part of our student voice model. Buddy Classes work together to establish an Action Team they will manage for the year. Students have opportunities to have authentic voice, have input on school decisions and events as well as make changes to make our school community even better. Already we have had students who are on the Fundraising Action Team, who met with the teachers and the parent Fundraising committee to discuss and give input and make suggestions for the upcoming Family BBQ.

It is wonderful to see the cross year level classes together.
