NAIDOC WEEK

Born from Aboriginal activism in the 1920 and 30s, NAIDOC week is an Indigienous-led celebration from history, cultures and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

Most libraries offer school holiday workshops for free or at a small cost, but due to popularity they often book out quickly.



MORIALTA STUDENT LEADERS WEC Data and Networking

On Thursday 22 June the Student Leaders from Stradbroke School met up at Norwood International High School with students from our partnership – Magill School, Vale Park School, Trinity Gardens School.



We met up to discuss and analyse last year's WEC (Wellbeing Engagement Collection survey) data and create a presentation about what

our school has been doing to improve the wellbeing of Stradbroke Students.

We shared that even though Wellbeing has been something we've always focussed on at Stradbroke School, there is now a goal about improving student engagement on the Site Improvement Plan this year.

We discussed why the data may have changed – Covid, not being at school at the start of last year for KidsMatter week and lots of absences and the year 7s going to high school. We shared our student voice model at Stradbroke which is the Action teams.

The Playtimes activities Action Team run lunchtime activities like Giant Connect 4, Checkers and Dominos for those who may find it hard to find someone to play with. We also shared the school events that have been bringing the Stradbroke School community back together, such as the Family BBQ, upcoming school DISCO, Harmony Day and Whole School Assemblies. We had a delicious recess provided by Norwood International High School.

We did a really exciting 'Goosechase' which involved 'Minute to Win It' activities and us running all over the High School doing tasks.

It was great experience for all the student leaders and we can't wait to meet up again next term to discuss this year's WEC data and make a plan!
