

# SCHOOL BUILDING FUND

The Stradbroke School Building Fund is used to improve school buildings and grounds. Improvements such as adding internal windows to Koonga and Leabrook classrooms, upgrading wet area sinks and cupboards, replacing external doors, adding pin boards, adding or upgrading cabling for technology and installing new technology can all be funded through the Stradbroke School Building Fund. The upgrades we are focussing on for 2017 are:



*Windows added to Koonga classrooms have increased light and the work spaces available for learning.*

1. Adding some internal walls and windows to Flexi building to accommodate increased classes predicted for 2017 (\$22000)
2. Adding internal windows to Leabrook and Koonga Buildings to increase light and usable spaces (\$8000/classroom)
3. Installing an Interactive Whiteboard to the Music Suite (\$7000)
4. Replacing the external doors to the main entrances of Koonga and Leabrook Buildings (\$28000)
5. Building rooms in the Koonga stairwells – this requires an engineering assessment to determine feasibility (approx. \$20000/stairwell)
