#### **PUPIL FREE DAY - REVIEWING AND EVALUATING STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT DATA &** SITE IMPROVEMENT PLAN 2023

On Friday 27 October the Stradbroke School Staff participated in a highly successful and very productive professional development day.

The focus was on evaluating the school site improvement plan, student achievement data and planning future directions for teaching and learning improvements in numeracy, literacy and wellbeing for 2024.

The teachers engaged in professional conversations about tracking and monitoring the progress of individual students, and year levels across the school, and examining challenges of teaching practice with the aim to add value to classroom practice across the whole school site and improve the achievement of all our students at Stradbroke School.

This year the focus was on a whole-school approach to teaching Numeracy, with a focus on mathematical proficiencies, in particular reasoning and problem solving.

The Pupil Free Day gave us an opportunity to collectively work and learn together, and make a continued "commitment to action" towards raising the achievement for all students in numeracy literacy and wellbeing.

I would like to thank the Stradbroke Governing Council for providing a generous morning tea as a gesture to recognise World Teacher's Day. Kera Palmer, Governing Council Chairperson, presented a thank you message to staff. The message was heartfelt and kind, acknowledging the wonderful work teachers do for the students at Stradbroke School.




#### JUNIOR PRIMARY FR3 -UNIT OF ENQUIRY


As a provocation to begin our new inquiry unit "sharing the planet" we have been exploring living and nonliving things.

After feedback from our peers, we reattempted to draw our mushrooms making the improvements based on our feedback.





#### JUNIOR PRIMARY – F6 UNIT OF INQUIRY

In the inquiry unit 'Parnati', F6 students have been learning about how Indigenous peoples refer to the natural environment to inform and explain their understanding of how the world works.

One of these ways was to notice the change of seasons. The number of seasons that occur are dependent on the area.

For example, in the Northern Territory there are two seasons: wet and dry, but Kakadu has six, our favourite being: 'Knock 'em down' storm season! In South Australia, Kaurna people recognise four seasons: Warltati (Summer), Parnati (Autumn), Kudlila (Winter) and Wirltuti (Spring).

The students enjoyed creating artworks to reflect the changing seasons.

If you know a book is lost or damaged, please organise payment via the finance office as soon as possible.


#### STORY BOX LIBRARY

## Stradbroke School Placement of Children in Classes for 2024

Planning for next year's classes will begin soon. In making recommendations about class composition, teachers consider factors such as:

- learning needs
- gender balance
- year level balance
- social and emotional maturity
- children with special needs and talents
- social dynamics (which children to keep together and which to keep apart)
- friendship groups
- the number of children per class.

Parents are invited to write a **short letter** to the Principal if you have specific information about the needs of your child that we may not have access to. **Please include your child's name, current year level and each student's requirements on a separate page (not one family letter).** 

Please do not make requests for a specific teacher. Due to enrolment numbers it is highly likely we will have composite classes, please do not make requests for your child to be or not be in a composite class. Be aware that not all requests can be met, in past years some letters have included 5-6 specific requests for one child and it is very unlikely that these can all be accommodated. If you do have more than one request please write them in priority order so that we know which aspects of your request are most important to you.

- Please place your letter in an envelope addressed to Tanya Scanlan.
- Parent letters are due by 4pm on Wednesday 8 November 2023.
- Parent information will be considered along with factors considered by our teachers and those listed above.
- Only information based on educational criteria will be considered.
- A copy of your letter will be made available to the class teachers who make the placements.
- A copy of the school class placement policy is on the school website.
- If you have made a specific request in the past, you will still need to include the information in a new letter.

Classroom teachers use a range of processes to ask children to nominate friends with whom they wish to be placed. It is preferable that parents do not write about friendship requests to us, unless there are serious issues.

At this stage class structures are not definite and the final allocation of teachers to classes, which will take place late in the term, is affected by the appointment of teachers.

#### Who makes the final decision?

Staff will do their best to meet your child's needs. You can be assured that we spend a great deal of time and effort in accommodating and allocating children to classes.

It is the responsibility of the Principal to make the final decision on classes and placement of students.

#### When will children and parents know about class placements?

If possible, class placement information will be sent home with students in the last week of term. After that date children's class placements will not be changed unless there are extenuating circumstances.

If you choose to provide information about your child, please ensure that requests are included in a short letter and sent to the Principal no later than **4pm on Wednesday 8 November 2023.**
